Pathways out of Poverty - An Anti-Poverty Strategy for Fermanagh and Omagh

Over the last six years, an average of 23% of the Fermanagh and Omagh population have been in relative poverty. Given the extent of poverty in our district, Fermanagh and Omagh District Council, along with a number of local organisations, has developed a draft Anti-Poverty Strategy — "Pathways out of Poverty". The draft strategy demonstrates the Council's commitment, together with statutory, community and voluntary sector partners, to tackle poverty and disadvantage in Fermanagh and Omagh.
