New Research: Pathways to engagement and work in dance on the island

A <u>research report and dance screen</u> film exploring pathways to engagement and work in dance experienced by dance artists and facilitators who live and / or work within territorial border areas of Cavan and Fermanagh and Omagh District Council areas is now available.

This research, entitled Sites of Significance, was funded by an award from Cavan County Council / Creative Ireland and in collaboration with Fermanagh and Omagh District Council and the UNESCO Global Geopark, Marble Arch Caves.

Combining dance and social science research methods, and taking inspiration from the underground rivers of the UNESCO Global Geopark that traverse the territorial borders of Ireland and Northern Ireland, Cavan and Fermanagh, the (often) invisible pathways to dance and connections between people and places were charted through movement, discussion, and auditing/mapping, allowing for choreographic and dialogic exploration and exchange.

Led by researchers Professor Aoife McGrath (Queen's University Belfast) and Dr Victoria Durrer (University College Dublin), the project team also included research assistant, Dr Argyro Tsampazi (Queen's University Belfast), videographer, Simon Mills, and composer, Sorca McGrath. The Sites of Significance film features 15 dance artists and facilitators working in the Cavan and Fermanagh / Omagh local authority areas, and further dance artists and facilitators supported the project through engagement with the audit research.

The project film is directed by McGrath and Mills, with concept by McGrath, editing by Mills, and original composition by Sorca McGrath.

Defibrillators: HeartSine® Samaritan® PAD 350P/360P/450P/500P, Omron HDF-3500 The HeartSine Samaritan PAD and Omron HDF-3500 are small, lightweight, portable, battery operated Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) designed to treat victims of cardiac arrest. We have determined that a manufacturing-related issue may impair device audio prompts. The issue could prevent the device from delivering instructional voice prompts to the user during use of the device.

The device has visual instructional icons still present and is functional, but if the issue is not identified by the customer prior to use, it could potentially lead to no therapy or a delay in therapy. In addition, there may be risk of shock to the user due to the absence of the "stand clear" voice prompt.

Community Garden Grants

Individual grants are between £1000 and £5000 for a fully set up community group, registered charity or Community Interest Company (CIC) with a functioning non-personal bank account. An application must relate to an existing or proposed community garden or similar site. There must be no query over access to the space (such as restrictions imposed by ownership by another body). Each application must itemise the details of the costs they are planning to cover. The following is an illustrative, but not exhaustive, list of items that may be eligible for funding:

- Plants and containers
- Materials for flower or vegetable beds and other hard landscaping
- Greenhouses, polytunnels and sheds
- Seating
- Hand tools and certain garden power tools (eg strimmers)

• Materials for providing refreshments (for example to get more people engaged in the garden refreshments can be for an event)

You need to say why you think your project should be considered for a Community Garden Grant. It is important to clearly describe the project, stating the anticipated short- and long-term benefits to a community, and how many people will be positively impacted. You also need to set out how the project will be maintained in the future.

It is important that your proposal demonstrates that you will be using sustainable gardening methods – for instance being as far as possible peat-free. We also celebrate biodiversity so demonstrating that your project will encourage biodiversity and wildlife, while not essential, will be a positive.

Applications must include either clear drawings and/or photographs showing the whole site of the proposed project. They must also include an indication of the site's area/size.

Applications close at 12 noon on Monday 28 October 2024.

It is strongly recommended that you do not leave your application to the last minute. Late applications will not have the benefit of feedback on any possible errors or anomalies from the Administrator. As a result, they will be more likely to fail.
