- Has the largest proportion of the Border Corridor (51%) enjoying a unique natural co-dependency in trade, investment, tourism and labour
- Is strategically located on a North/South/East/West axis
- Has sectoral strengths in advanced manufacturing, engineering, agri-food, health and life sciences, tourism and construction

MSW ECONOMIC GROWTH CHALLENGES

- Wages remain below NI average by 9%.
- Real GVA average growth rate is forecast to be 1.5% below the NI average (1.6%)
- MSW's productivity levels are 2% lower than the rest of Northern Ireland, Northern Ireland's productivity level is 19% below the UK average and 40% below the Republic of Ireland average.
- Industrial land deficit
- 2% of private investment in innovative businesses.
- Need sustained Tourism investment to achieve more dispersed attractions across NI
- Underdeveloped road infrastructure and devoid of rail infrastructure.
- 12% of regional Super Output Areas (SOAs) fall within the top 10% most deprived areas of NI.




