

Name of the Programme	Seachtain na Gaeilge - 2025
Programme Dates	Funding covers the period: 1 March 2025 – 17 March 2025
Brief Description	Seachtain na Gaeilge is the largest Irish Language festival in the world celebrating the native language and heritage of Ireland, with great events taking place across different countries every year. Fermanagh and Omagh District Council invites community groups to apply for funding of up to £200 to hold events during Seachtain na Gaeilge 2025. The Council welcomes proposals for events that raise awareness and use of the Irish Language in creative and engaging ways. Events must take place during Seachtain na Gaeilge 1 March 2025 – 17 March 2025.
Programme Specific Criteria	Fermanagh and Omagh District Council defines an event as: "An organised special occasion and activity of limited duration that brings people together for the primary purpose of participating in an uplifting community, cultural, recreational, sporting, artistic or entertaining experience". Events for Seachtain na Gaeilge must focus on one or more of the following: • raise awareness of the Irish Language • promote greater understanding of the Irish Language • offer opportunities to learn and/or use the Irish Language. Examples of events include, but are not limited to: • Irish language learning and/or language awareness events/activities; • language learning and educational resources, both digital and/or printed publications; • lectures, talks, or presentations in or about Irish language; • drama and/or performance events/activities in or about Irish Language • storytelling and/or poetry readings in or about Irish language; • author or writer-led events which showcase the author's original work in or about the Irish Language and/or which explore the Irish Language literary tradition; • creative writing events in or about the Irish Language; • digital content, including audio, video, and/or multimedia content in or about the Irish Language which can be shared on the web, social media and other platforms. Funding constraints: • Tutors/Facilitators must be external to the organisation and capped at £25 maximum p/hr. • Refreshments will only be awarded up to a maximum of 20% of grant aid allocation. • Irish Language must be central to the event. Events can be bilingual.

- Events **must** take place in the Fermanagh and Omagh District Council area.
- Events must take place between 1-17 March 2025.
- St Patrick's Day events are not eligible.

Activities and items that can NOT be funded:

- Retrospective applications.
- Fundraising events or activities.
- Organisations own facility hire groups cannot claim for and pay for the use of their own facilities
- Recognition events
- Capital costs
- Equipment costs
- Salary costs

Scoring Criteria

Applicants must provide information on the proposed event – date/time/event activity and demonstrate how the event will make a positive contribution to the visibility and appreciation of Irish Language in their community.

 - What is the event– describe the activity to be delivered. If providing Irish Language class at what level – beginner/intermediate/advanced. Have you sourced tutors for the class(s)

 - How will you acknowledge funding from Fermanagh and Omagh District Council

The projects that exceed the threshold will be allocated funding with remaining funds allocated to the next highest ranked projects, until funding has been expended.
